

Uniform Licensure Requirements for **Renewing** a Multi-State License

Virginia enacted the Enhanced Licensure Compact (eNLC) **effective July 20, 2017, implemented on January 19, 2018**. Under the eNLC, in order to receive a license with multi-state privilege, applicants must meet all Uniform Licensure Requirements (ULRs) in accordance with [Virginia Code § 54.1-3040.3 C](#).

- If you held a Virginia license with multi-state privilege **prior to July 20, 2017** you are grandfathered under the eNLC;
- However, if **after** July 20, 2017 you had *any disqualifying event* listed below from the Uniform Licensure Requirements (ULRs) you may be ineligible to retain and renew a license with multi-state privilege in accordance with [Virginia Code § 54.1-3040.3 G](#). If you do not meet the ULRs you may be eligible for a single-state license authorizing practice *only* in Virginia.

Uniform Licensure Requirements

1. Has not been convicted or found guilty, or has entered into an agreed disposition, of a felony offense under applicable state or federal criminal law;
2. Has not been convicted or found guilty, or has entered into an agreed disposition, of a misdemeanor offense related to the practice of nursing as determined on a case-by-case basis;
3. Is not currently enrolled in an alternative program;
4. Is subject to self-disclosure requirements regarding current participation in an alternative program;
5. Has a valid United States Social Security number.
